Minutes from January 17 meeting were reviewed, and were unanimously approved with one change; the addition of Nancy Waring to the list of attendees.

Treasurer's report – Carol Flannagan reporting

It was a relatively quiet month. JB pulled in \$500 for a gig they played in December. We will likely meet our fundraising goal. Our bank balance is \$63,199. Much of this will go to tour. The final tour cost is not settled. Do not make final payment at this point. One hundred and fifty kids are going on tour with seventeen adults. See attached Financial Highlights.

- We have a whirlwind of activity coming up with Festivals, Bands in Review and Orchestra Night next Thursday. Orchestra sounded amazing today.
- VB is working on Picnic Pops music now. They do not do festival. Thanks for sending her to Chicago where she was able to pick out music. Thanks also for the Pixar piece.

David Leach:

- Super happy about the winter concert; pleased with the crowd, the small ensembles, VB, JB, CB and SB.
- This Thursday Dr. Mary Schneider, Director of Bands at Eastern Michigan, will work with SB and CB. On Monday night Jonathan Madden, Marching Band Director and Asst. Director of Bands at Michigan State University, will work with SB.

- Festivals are March 3rd and we will need help. The day starts with the first band at 8am. Last group performs at 4:50. Come to sight reading! It is spectacular to watch!
- March 10th is the Navy Band performance. David is carefully rolling out the news. Get your tickets now before he releases them to the public. Arrive 30 minutes before the concert, because 15 minutes before the concert starts any empty seats will be opened up to people without tickets waiting in line. It will be crowded! It will be an amazing concert, 2 hours and 20 min. with a break.
- Saturday, March 24th is State Solo and Ensemble festivals and Bands in Review in the evening. Symphony Band does not play on Sunday.
- Three days after Spring Break we get on a bus for our NYC Tour. SB will be working with members of the NY Philharmonic, CB will work with a Broadway conductor and JB will work with someone from Jazz at Lincoln Center. Exciting news: our Carnegie Hall concert has been changed from an afternoon concert to a PRIME TIME 8:30pm Saturday night event! It will be a late night because after the concert we will take a 12:00am cruise and be back to the hotel for a 2:30am bed check! Hoping to move our departure time later on Sunday so the kids can sleep in a bit.
