### **Directors' Reports**

**Nancy Waring was absent due to the Orchestra Concert:**

#### **David Leach:**

- December 4th was the MSU Jazz Band and Pioneer Jazz Band concert. MSU had a great time. We fed them well and they loved it. They ran masterclasses with each section. The two groups (MSU and Pioneer JB) sightread Rain Check and then performed it together. We had an increase in audience size this year. David guesses we had 150-200 people. It was a magnificent concert!!
- He and Nancy will be leaving the 19th for the Midwest Clinic in Chicago. This year they are honoring Elizabeth A H Green, founder of the Orchestra program at Pioneer and Conducting icon at University of Michigan. There will be many Ann Arbor and U of M connections. Dan Long, John Whitwell and H. Robert Reynolds will all be making presentations. David will be looking at possible trips for next year's tour.
- On December 9 Jazz Band performed at Cliff Bell's in Detroit. It was a packed house. Sean Dobbins started the collaboration 4-5 years ago. This year big wigs from Detroit Civic came to listen and they now want to come to Ann Arbor to see how we can develop the relationship.
- Rodney Whitaker has suggested that the JB apply for the Essentially Ellington competition. The competition takes place in May in NYC. Jazz Band would need to submit a recording of 3 Ellington charts. Twelve to fifteen groups are invited to attend and 3 are chosen to perform on stage with the Lincoln Center Jazz Society. The cost would be about \$1000 per student. Some students may need help. There will be scholarship requests.
- David and David Baum are working on the contract for Michael Daugherty. That commissioning project is moving along.

- SB has started rehearsing the trumpet concerto and Jean Libs will be in next week to rehearse.
- SB worked with John Whitwell. It was a treat! The kids were great!
- CB is magnificent. They are excited to play Metroplex at Bands in Review.
- The Ann Arbor high school music directors are planning to use the same music citywide for Varsity Band auditions. This is being worked out.
- David Leach had an article published in a travel magazine about his experiences taking the bands on tour.
- The Centennial concert is a citywide event. Jason Smith and Steve Roberts are on board with these plans. David would like to use Hill, but the others are concerned about the expense. Each HS Symphony Band would play in the first half. Then an honors band, made up of the first 3 chairs of each section, would perform the Daugherty piece. Gail Stout is still on board to help with this project.
- JB is playing at the Michigan Music Conference in Grand Rapids on the 19th of January. We will have 3 guest artists, Jack Wagner, Adam Unsworth and Rodney Whitaker.

- We will have 200 mugs on hand to sell at the winter concert. Can we store 200 mugs at Pioneer? Yes, David says he has a closet with space.

- Delivery is Tuesday 12/18. We need 4 volunteers from 12-3 and 2 from 3-5. Pick up ends at 5:00pm. Please save newspapers and paper grocery bags for delivery. The kids will wrap their own mugs to take home.

##### **David Baum reporting for Helen Starman on Gala**

- Amy Higgins and Helen Starman have laid the groundwork for Gala. It will be a very different kind of event this year, but hopefully more manageable in the years to come. There will be no auction. It will take place at Zingerman's Roadhouse, a great venue with wonderful food. The focus will be on the kids with performances and the option to make donations to the program. Tickets will be \$45 (we make \$18.00 per ticket). Band students will be competing to win the opportunity to perform at the Gala. Amy Higgins will head this up. It is guaranteed that there will be one group from each of the bands (VB, CB, SB and JB) chosen to perform. Amy will line up judges. The event will last

two hours starting at either 6:30 or 7:00pm on March 13, a Wednesday evening. The fundraising goal is \$25,000. We hope to have 150-160 attendees with an average donation of just over \$100.00. We also hope to collect \$7,000 in sponsorships. We may have a large score of Push On to hang on the wall, filling in notes as we receive donations.
